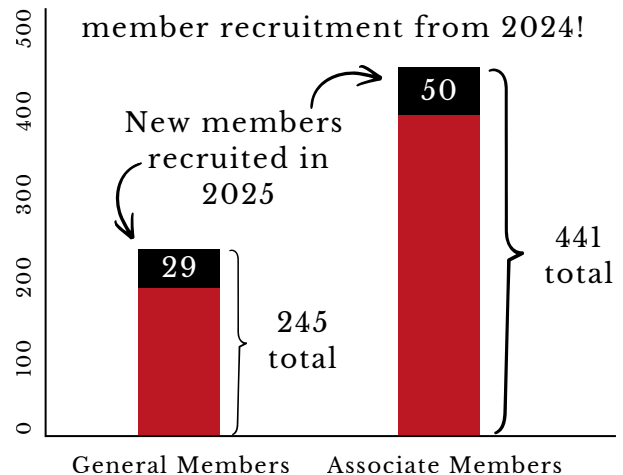

AGC of Texas marked a historic milestone at the beginning of 2025 by bringing together over **400 members** and partners at the **Centennial Celebration** to honor a century of leadership, advocacy, and impact. The following day, at **AGC of Texas' Capitol Day**, **150 members** engaged directly with state leaders to advance key legislative priorities and reinforce AGC's strong presence at the capitol.

Throughout the year, **area PAC events** across the state raised an impressive **\$511,165**, with member-driven events and fundraisers playing a vital role in supporting pro-construction leadership and AGC's advocacy mission. The **170 1924 Club Members** provided additional financial support to the PAC.

Over the summer, **Management Conference** in Pebble Beach welcomed **370 attendees** for legislative-focused programming, while the **Administrative Conference** brought together **442 participants** for regulatory updates and peer connection designed to strengthen day-to-day operations and member success.

In the fall, the **Scholarship Gala** raised a **record-breaking \$1.55 million**, enabling the Chapter to award **43 scholarships**, 16 of which were awarded to technical and vocational students, from nearly 200 applicants.

The year concluded with the AGC of Texas **Christmas Party**, where **360 members** and guests gathered to celebrate the season, reflect on a successful year, and strengthen the relationships that define AGC of Texas.

During the **89th Legislative Session**, AGC of Texas played a key role in advancing policies that strengthen the state's transportation network, workforce pipeline, and long-term infrastructure resilience. The Legislature approved **historic investments in TxDOT funding**, including more than **\$35 billion** for the design, construction, and maintenance of the state highway system.

Significant progress was also made in **water and energy infrastructure**. Lawmakers approved **\$2.5 billion in new funding** for critical water projects through HB 500, along with a proposed long-term funding commitment of **\$1 billion annually** from 2027–2047, which voters approved. **\$5 billion** was directed to the **Texas Energy Fund** to support construction of new power generation facilities—both priorities strongly supported by AGC of Texas.

AGC of Texas also championed workforce development and safety initiatives, including legislation requiring **work zone safety education** in driver's education courses. Voters approved a **\$850 million endowment for Texas State Technical College**, aimed at expanding workforce training capacity statewide. While not all priorities crossed the finish line—including efforts related to automated work zone speed enforcement and tort reform—AGC of Texas remained a consistent and effective advocate throughout the session, ensuring the construction industry's voice was heard on issues critical to Texas' future.

**OUR WORK ISN'T DONE.** Sustained success depends on continued engagement from our members. The groundwork for the next legislative session—beginning in 2027—starts now. We invite members to invest in the future of our industry by joining **the 1924 Club**, our premier advocacy program. Members are also encouraged to stay involved by attending AGC of Texas events and lending their expertise through **committees and task forces**. Together, we will remain proactive, prepared, and united in advancing the policies that keep Texas' infrastructure program the best in the nation.
